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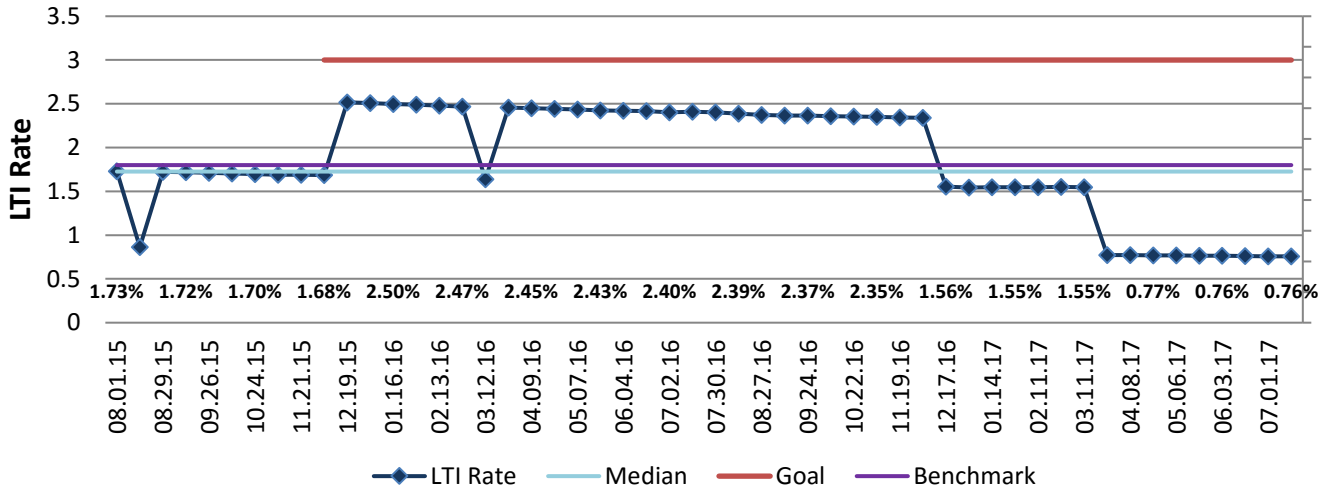
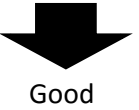

Baseline: 6% in July 2014 Goal: Maintain LTI Rate Below 3% Benchmark: 1.8% all local gov Nov2013	Data Source: OSHA Logs & Payable Time Goal Source: Scope Summary Benchmark Source: Bureau Labor Statistics	Plan-Do-Check-Act Step 3: Determine and quantify root causes Measurement Method: In a 12 month period, # of OSHA recordables with lost work days times 200,000 divided by the total # of hours worked Why Measure: minimize number & severity of workplace injuries/illness Next Improvement Step: Analyze current safety programs and create safety action plan.
